



**Worship Response**  
**Day One: Follow Jesus**

Sit together in a circle and **ASK** the following questions, affirming all answers:

- How was the image in your passport different than what the final drawing looked like?
- When did you start to see what the drawing would become in the end? How did you feel?
- How was this an example of “transformation” - something becoming different that it was?

**READ:** Don't be like the people of this world, but let God change the way you think. Then you will know how to do everything that is good and pleasing to him. (Romans 12:2 CEV)

**ASK:**

- What do you think God wants you to think about? Affirm all their answers, and they may be in this zone: being kind, loving others, doing good, loving God, listening at church, etc.
- What do you think the people of the world want you to think about? Like, what do commercials on TV want you to think about? (buying things, looking a certain way, cool kids have these things, etc.)

**SAY:** Tonight, our pastor talked about when we choose to follow Jesus, we begin to see others with a different view. We begin to see things the way Jesus sees them, and we begin to do things the way Jesus would do them.

**ASK:**

- What DID Jesus do when he walked on earth? (Loved others unconditionally, helped the outcasts, healed the sick, etc. Affirm all answers)
- How do you think Jesus saw and felt about the world and the people around him? (Cared for everyone, saw everyone as special that God created and loves, etc. Affirm all answers.)
- How can you change our view to be more like Jesus? (Instruct campers to write their answers inside their Passport. Allow campers to share what they wrote if they wish.)
- Would this change be easy or hard for you?



**SAY:** Sometimes it's hard for us to make changes. It's easy to keep what we have always done. But when we love Jesus and choose to follow him, we will want to change our view to be more like the way Jesus sees others. When we follow Jesus, we will want to care for everyone, just like Jesus did.

**PRAY:** Jesus, we thank you for all the things we are able to do in our lives. We thank you for the ability to wake, to go to school, to eat, to play, and to talk with others. As we follow you, help our lives to be transformed and to change. Help us to be able to see people the way you see them. Help us to love others the way you love them. As we learn to Do. Love. Walk. this week, help us to hear your voice so we can better love others. Amen.

**Worship Response**  
**Day Two: Do Justice, Love Kindness**

Sit together in a circle and have the campers reflect on what they saw, sang, did and felt during the worship service. Ask the following questions to help them think through the different aspects of worship.

**ASK:**

- *What items were brought into the service during the processional that you noticed? (purple and red streamers from the "Do" and "Love" paint cans, loaf of bread, tools, Christ candle)*
- *What songs did you like singing?*
- *What did you think of our prayer experience? How did it feel when you wrote down things that prevent you from showing over kindness? How did it feel when the piece of paper dissolved with your thoughts on it?*
- *Today's question of the day was, "How did you notice someone being kind today?" What's your answer to the question of the day?*

Let's read the verse of the day together. Have the campers turn in their Passports to the verse of the day and read along with you.

***"I am the Lord who acts with kindness, justice, and righteousness in the world, and I delight in these things," declares the Lord." Jeremiah 9:24b***

**SAY:** *Today we learned about the story of the Good Samaritan story in Bible Study and Worship. Ask for a camper, who is willing, to retell the story of the Good Samaritan.*

**ASK:**

- *There were three people who passed the hurt man on the road. The Priest, the Levite, and the Samaritan. What did each of these men do when they saw the hurt man?*
- *Why was it surprising that the Priest and Levite did not help the hurt man?*
- *Why was it surprising the Samaritan DID help the hurt man?*
- *When we think about doing justice and loving kindness, which person in our story did just that?*

**SAY:** *Turn to the worship response page in your passport with the heart. Write the name of someone you need to show loving kindness to the way that Jesus calls us to. (You may need to help them: someone in their family, school, community, church, etc.)*

*Our verse of the day says that the Lord is delighted when we act with kindness and justice. When Jesus told the story of the Good Samaritan, he was teaching us that we are called to love others, no matter who they are. We love others because God loves them.*



**PRAY:** *Jesus, we know you want us to show others kindness and justice just like the Good Samaritan did. Sometimes we forget to show others kindness, and justice. Forgive us. Help our hearts to be filled with your love so we can show kindness and justice the way you do. Help us to be the Good Samaritans in the world. Amen.*

## Worship Response Day Three: *Walk Humbly with God*

Sit together in a circle and ask each camper to share their favorite moment from today with the group. For larger church groups, have campers get into smaller groups (3-4) to share with each other.

Ask for one camper to volunteer for a game. Mark a starting point and a finishing point that's approximately 10 feet away from the starting point. The goal of the game is for the camper to get successfully from the starting point to the finishing point.

Select a second camper to give directions to the first camper on how to get from the start to the finish line. Tell all the other campers their job is to shout out things so the first camper has a hard time hearing the directions.

Place the first camper at the starting point. Instruct the camper to close their eyes – no peeking. Spin the camper around 10 times, and then tell the camper to walk to the finish line while one camper gives directions and the other campers shout out wrong directions.

After a few minutes, have the camper start over. This time only let the one camper speak and give directions. Have the other campers remain quiet.

### **ASK:**

- *When we played the game the first time, was it hard/easy for him/her to find the finish line? Why?*
- *The second time, it was a little easier for the camper to make it to the finish line. Why?*

**SAY:** *Today we have been talking about how we are to follow God's path, and that God can light the way to the path. This means that God will show us how we are to act, what decisions we should make, and how we can help others. Sometimes it's hard to know God's path.*

*In our story today, we learned about Naaman's skin disease. Two people helped Naaman find God's path so he could be healed.*

### **ASK:**

- *Who are the two people who helped Naaman? (The servant girl, and Elisha)*
- *How did these people help Naaman on the right path to be healed? (The servant girl told Naaman about God's prophet who could help him. Elisha told Naaman to wash in the river seven times.)*

**SAY:** *God is always guiding us on God's path. When we have a hard time knowing which path God wants us to take, God puts people in our lives to help us.*

Help the campers to think of different people who can help them follow God's path and walk humbly with God. These people can be parents, Sunday School teachers, friends, a minister at church, etc. Instruct campers to write the names of the people they think of in their Passport on the "road."



**PRAY:** *Jesus, we thank you that you show us what path we should take. Thank you for guiding us to make the right decisions, to show kindness, to do justice, and to walk humbly with you. Thank you for the special people in our lives who can help show us your path. Amen.*

**Worship Response**  
**Day Four: Do. Love. Walk**

Sit together in a circle and ask campers to share their favorite memory from camp this week. For larger groups, have campers get in groups of 3-4 to share.

Ask each camper to read the verse of the day with you from their Passport.

*"God chose you to be his people. I tell you now to live the way God's people should live." Ephesians 4:1 (ICB)*

**SAY:** *This week at camp we have been learning do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God. Think about all the things we have talked about in your Bible study groups, during worship, and our bedtime devotions.*

**ASK:**

- *What is something that you have learned this week?*
- *How have you lived out Do, Love, Walk at camp this week?*
- *How can you Do, Love, Walk when you go back home? How can you live this out at school? In your neighborhood? At church?*
- *Will this be easy or hard for you? Why?*
- *Who can help you do this at home?*
- *What can help you remember what you've learned at camp once you get home?*

**SAY:** *This afternoon we will head back home. Tonight, you will be sleeping in your own bed, and you'll wake back up in [insert the name of your city]. It's important for us to remember what we have learned here at camp so when we wake up at home tomorrow we can start putting into action what we have learned.*

Tell campers to turn into their Passport to the Worship Response page with the house on it. Tell them to write down one way they can do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God at home. This can be something they do in their neighborhood, at school, at church, or anywhere else they go.

Have campers partner up with one person and share what they are going to do when they get home.

**PRAY:** *God, we thank you for letting us come to camp this week as we played with our friends and met new friends. Thank you for the fun we had at our rec party, during camper's choice, and in our Bible study groups. But we thank you most of all for the things we learned here at camp. As we go home today, help us to travel safely to our families. And as we travel help us to remember how we plan to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with you at home. Amen.*
